Exhibiting at the Fair

Step 1: Register as an exhibitor

Exhibitor's fee is \$6 for adults, and gives you free admission to the Fair-grounds all day. Those aged 12 or under may exhibit at no charge, unless entering adult classes.

Contact details and exhibitor fee can be given to the Treasurer in the Ameliasburgh Town Hall between 6 - 7pm on Thurs 18th Sept, or 4 - 8pm on Fri. 19th Sept. To save time, you can pre-register your contact info (no payment) at AmeliasburghFallFair.ca/getready

Step 2: Complete your entry inventory *(optional)*

You may find it helpful to complete an entry inventory and provide it to the convener for each division you are exhibiting in. This inventory lists all your exhibits for that division, and can be completed in-person during the Friday registration period.

Step 3: Attach entry tags to your exhibits

The Treasurer will provide entry tags at registration, which must be completed and attached to your exhibits. Tags must be attached by the exhibitor, and folded such that exhibitor no. and name are not visible.

First time exhibiting? Don't forget to add "New Exhibitor" to your tag (in the hidden part) to be eligible for the Rob Cannons Award.

All entries must be placed in their proper class, with entry tags and entry inventory (if applicable) between 4 - 8pm on Friday 19th September 2025 to qualify for judging.

Step 4: See how you did!

Judging begins when registration closes at 8pm, and the judged exhibits are unveiled at 10am on Fair day. Prize money can be collected from the Treasurer after 4pm (optional: 2026's entry fee can be deducted from winnings - please advise Treasurer).

**Exhibits may ONLY be removed
between 5 - 6pm on Saturday 20th September 2025**

Exhibiting Rules

Entry tags

- All exhibits must be labelled on tags provided by the Treasurer at registration on Thurs. 18th and Fri. 19th September.
- Entry tags should have **class number, division, exhibitor no. and names only**. Youth division entry tags should include grade level, class and school name.
- Judges and attendants cannot correct any errors on the tags so be careful in filling them out, and please print clearly!

Entering exhibits

- Only one entry per class per exhibitor
- Optional: you may submit an entry inventory with your exhibits if you wish to. These will be available at registration.
- The Ameliasburgh Fall Fair, or its Board, is not responsible for any loss, theft or damage to entries.
- Items must be the work of the exhibitor (i.e. made, grown, painted). Exhibits must be of prize-winning condition and not shown previously at the Ameliasburgh Fair.
- Exhibits must be dropped off **4 - 8pm Friday 19th Sept. 2025** to qualify for judging. Items received outside of this time will not be accepted.
- Judges' decisions as entered on the judge's sheets are final.
- To give others a chance, the recipients of special awards at last year's Fair are not eligible for the same awards this year.

Collecting exhibits

- Exhibits may only be removed between 5 - 6pm on Fair day.
- The Fair board is not responsible for exhibits left after 6pm.
